1. Welcome & Administrative:

- Roll call completed with both in-person and virtual participants.
- Agenda approved without modification.
- **GC MOTION: 2025 Q1 GC Meeting Minutes approved** (Ostdiek moved, Brundage seconded).

2. Advisory Committee Updates:

- LAC – Approved Platte River Recreation Access recommendations, grassland updates, 650 acres prescribed fire burns.
- WAC – Hydrology leasing, Cottonwood maintenance, Elwood feasibility study, EA scoring/accounting discussion.
- TAC – Whooping crane monitoring, sediment augmentation, West/Ecotope policy discussion.
- FC – Outreach contractor terminated; tasks reassigned to DJ Case.

3. Executive Director's Report:

- New personalized GC web portal in beta, release expected by September.
- 2025 expenditures at \$2.8M of \$12.7M budget, typical for time of year.
- Pallid sturgeon billing caught up; no contract overrun.
- \$42M in first increment carryover remains; \$140M under extension ceiling.



4. Budget Overview:

- FY25 federal appropriation pending; FY26 request submitted.
- Indexing dropped 0.6%; stable after 2021–22 spike.
- Program financially stable with carryover reserves.

5. Science Plan Update:

- Whooping Crane – 89 individuals observed, avg. 2-day stopovers; highest 13 days.
- Plovers – 48 nests, 11 hatched; skunks and owls identified as primary predators.
- Pallid Sturgeon – 53 detected; 1 spawning female exited system, likely spawned in Missouri.

6. Independent Science (ISAC):

- PRRIP practices align with 2024 DOI science integrity policy.
- New DOI policy under review.
- Public access to scientific data reaffirmed.
- Schellpeper asked about Scientific Data Storage and Release Policy. Does that move forward even if DOI policy has been revised? Farnsworth said yes, will go through the TAC for review first, but yes. EDO is working to keep data high quality, secure, and open to use. Mead said the GC should note that many practices in the memo are already in place or being improved upon. Marmorek asked about the ISAC’s recommendation to identify Scientific Integrity coordinators. He asked one way to think of this is, “Who would someone go to if they had a concern?” Mead said chair of GC would receive identified concern and then work the concern through the PRRIP process as appropriate.

7. PRRIP Water Plan:

- CPNRD Agreement – 14,300 AF for 2025; program benefits from water control.
- Discussion on water rights, canal rehab, post-2032 uncertainty.
- Both CPNRD and NPPD leasing agreements deferred pending further review, plan to discuss during 2025 Q3 GC Meeting (September).

8. North Platte Chokepoint:

- Ostdiek asked if we needed a motion at this time. Farnsworth, no motion necessary, just agreement that this document represents where we are at. Miller asked if this says we are done with the chokepoint? Farnsworth said, his understanding is that unless something novel comes up, the Program is done looking at the chokepoint. Rabbe said chokepoint was a priority set out for First Increment Extension. Service says Program obligation for First Increment and Extension has been met. Chokepoint may still be an issue to be negotiated for the Second Increment (up for grabs for a second increment). Walters said we are done pending any new, novel information the Program has not yet considered. If that happens, Program obligated to take a look. Policy Framing Document edited by the group and finalized, will be posted on the PRRIP website.



9. PRRIP Land Plan:

- Updates on Phragmites control, conservation land tracking.
- Platte River Recreation Access (PRRA) Subcommittee results presented.

10. Public Comment:

- No public comments recorded.

11. Executive Session:

- Marshall Flowage Easement discussed.
- **GC MOTION (out of Executive Session): Execute the flowage easement with Jeff Marshall at Cottonwood Ranch Property** (Merrill moved, Mehling seconded).

12. Meeting Review & Wrap-Up:

- Action items reviewed.
- Farnsworth asked for volunteers to help guide outreach development (information and education) by DJ Case. Volunteers included The Crane Trust, Nebraska DNR, State of Colorado, State of Wyoming.
- Upcoming GC Meetings: Q3 in September (Kearney, NE), virtual 2026 budget meeting in November, Q4 in December (Berthoud, CO).
