I. OVERVIEW

The Platte River Recovery Implementation Program ("Program" or "PRRIP") was initiated on January 1, 2007 between Nebraska, Wyoming, Colorado, and the Department of the Interior to address threatened and endangered species issues in the central and lower Platte River basin. The species considered in the Program, referred to as "target species", are the whooping crane, piping plover, interior least tern, and pallid sturgeon.

A Governance Committee (GC) reviews, directs, and provides oversight for activities undertaken by the Program. The GC is comprised of one representative from each of the three states, three water user representatives, two representatives from environmental groups, and two members representing federal agencies. The GC named Jason Farnsworth to serve as the Program Executive Director (ED). Headwaters Corporation provides the staffing mechanism for the Program (ED, Deputy ED, and all Program staff), which is referred to as the Executive Director's Office (EDO). EDO staff are located in Nebraska and Colorado and are responsible for carrying out Program-related activities.

 One of the major components of Program implementation is acquisition and management of 10,000 acres of habitat for the benefit of target species in the central Platte River. To date, approximately 12,500 acres have been acquired and are being managed by the EDO on behalf of the Program. Titles to Program lands are held by the Platte River Recovery Implementation Foundation (PRRIF) which is managed through and by the Nebraska Community Foundation, the Program's Financial Management Entity. The purpose of this RFP is to solicit proposals from qualified Contractors to provide professional services in relation to the disposal of three excess Program land tracts. The selected Contractor will widely advertise the upcoming sale of the three properties, accept sealed bids for the sale of each property, and work with representatives of the PRRIF to handle all work related to real estate contracts and closing the sales.

II. WORK DESCRIPTIOIN & SCOPE OF WORK

Work Description

The Program is requesting proposals from experienced Contractors to provide professional services in relation to the disposal of three excess Program land tracts. The performance period for this work will begin on April 1 and will end once the sale for each of the three land tracts closes.

Scope of Work

The selected Contractor will develop sale advertisements for each excess Program land tract with specific details to allow a potential buyer to bid on the purchase of one, two, or all three available lands. Advertisements will include dates of submission, contact information for obtaining final details for bid submission, required pre-bid submissions, and numbers to contact for further information or questions about the sale. Each of the three properties will be offered for sale under written bid proposals with the bid period



ending on Monday, April 30, 2018. The Contractor will be solely responsible for advertising and will NOT be responsible for activities associated with closing.

III. PROJECT DESCRIPTION – EXCESS PROGRAM LAND TRACTS

Three land tracts were deemed excess and approved for disposal by the Program's Governance Committee in December 2017:

- Tract 1715 114 acres in Hall County Nebraska
- Tract 1716 461 acres in Hall County Nebraska
- Tract 1717 181 acres in Phelps County Nebraska

Maps for each tract can be found in **Attachment A** and a descriptive summary of each tract follows:

<u>Tract 1715</u> – 114 acres Hall County: timbered peninsula located on blacktop highway U.S. 11 next to the main channel of the Platte River on the south and a branch on the north side of this peninsula. An inholding is in the center of the land with a new fence. The inholding has permission to cross from U. S. Highway 11 for access. It does not have Platte River bed title on the main channel. It does have access to the north branch of the Platte River.

<u>Tract 1716</u> – 461 acres Hall County: undulating grassland with access along Shoemaker Island gravel road. North side of the land is a minor channel of the Platte River. Area is well-fenced.

<u>Tract 1717</u> – 181 acres Phelps County: pastureland with associated bottomland including the historic south channel of the Platte River. South boundary is a new fence. West side will have an access easement remaining with the seller.

The EDO will coordinate with the selected Contractor during the development of marketing materials and will provide additional detail related to the excess tracts as necessary.

IV. CONTRACT TERMS

The selected Contractor will be retained by:

Contracted services will be performed on a time and material not to exceed basis. Under the final contract, written Notice to Proceed from the Executive Director will be required before work begins. All work will be contingent on availability of Program funding.

V. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All interested parties having experience providing the services described in this RFP are requested to submit a proposal.

Proposals can be submitted either electronic or hard copy format. Details are below:

The proposal must be received by the deadline to be considered. Late proposals will not be accepted It is the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure the electronic version of the proposal is of adequate size to be delivered via email.

Proposal Content

1) **Executive summary:** Provide an overview of the project that condenses and highlights the contents of the proposal in such a way as to provide a broad understanding of the Contractor's qualifications and

proposal approach.

2) **Project understanding:** Discussion that demonstrates the Contractor's understanding of the project's purpose, key design elements, and constraints.

 3) **Project approach:** Discussion of the Contractor's approach to providing the engineering design and construction administration services detailed in this RFP. The proposal should include critical issues, tasks, and other key considerations that formulated the approach detailed in the RFP. Please note: the scope provided in this document was done so as general guidance and original thinking and/or

discussion of improvements to the approach/scope are welcome.

4) **Qualifications:** Discussion of the qualifications of the Contractor. The Contractor should include relevant projects completed by the team, team organization, and resumes/qualifications and

responsibilities of the individuals on the team.

Proposals should respond to the following general topics:

5) **Schedule:** Identify general schedule and critical issues for each of the tasks. As stated, the final scope/schedule will be negotiated following the selection of the winning Contractor.

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Products Provide an estimated hydrot based on the Contractor's approach. Including

6) **Budget:** Provide an estimated budget based on the Contractor's approach. Include sub tasks and descriptions, complete with labor rates, estimated hours and total costs. Please include assumptions. This budget will be the basis for contract negotiation upon award of the project, once a final scope is

agreed to by the Contractor and the EDO.



7) **Conflict of interest statement:** Address whether any potential conflict of interest exists between this project and other past or on-going projects, including any projects currently being conducted for the Program.

8) **DUNS number:** Provide a statement affirming that the Contractor is NOT on the federal suspended and disbarred list and provide Dun & Bradstreet (DUNS) number.

<u>Criteria for Evaluating Proposals</u>

The EDO will evaluate all proposals and select a Contractor based on the following principal considerations:

1. The Contractor's understanding of the project, including: goals, constraints, and general approach.

2. The Contractor's approach to meeting those objectives as detailed in the proposal. Budget will be a consideration in this task (note: selection will not be made based solely on the Contractor's budget, it will simply be a key consideration).

3. The Contractor's qualifications and the relevant experience of the proposed project team members. Specifically, prior experience with the advertisement and sale of Platte River land tracts.

4. Clarity and content of the proposal.

Award Notice

After completing the evaluation of all proposals, the Program will select a Contractor. If the Program is unable to negotiate a mutually-satisfactory contract with the selected Contractor, it may, at its sole discretion, cancel and begin negotiations with another Contractor or reissue a new RFP.

Program Perspective

The GC has the sole discretion and reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received in response to this RFP and to cancel this solicitation if it is deemed in the best interest of the Program to do so. Issuance of this RFP in no way constitutes a commitment by the Program to award a contract, or to pay Contractor's costs incurred either in the preparation of a response to this RFP or during negotiations, if any, of a contract for services. The Program also reserves the right to make amendments to this RFP by giving written notice to Contractors, and to request clarification, supplements, and additions to the information provided by a Contractor.

By submitting a proposal in response to his solicitation, Contractors understand and agree that any selection of a Contractor or any decision to reject any or all responses or to establish no contracts shall be at the sole discretion of the Program. To the extent authorized by law, the Contractor shall indemnify, save, and hold harmless the Nebraska Community Foundation, the states of Colorado, Wyoming, and Nebraska, the Department of the Interior, members of the Governance Committee, and the Executive Director's Office, their employees, employers, and agents, against any and all claims, damages, liability, and court awards including costs, expenses, and attorney fees incurred as a result of any act or omission by the Contractor or its employees, agents, sub-contractors, or assignees pursuant to the terms of this project. Additionally, by submitting a proposal, Contractors agree that they waive any claim for the recovery of any costs or expenses

incurred in preparing and submitting a proposal.





Tract 1715








