1 Welcome and Administrative

- Chairman Czaplewski called the meeting to order at 11:00 am Central Time and the group
 proceeded with introductions.
- 3 proceede
- 5 Czaplewski asked for agenda modifications. No modifications requested.
- 7 Czaplewski asked for the LAC's recommendation on the minutes of the October 2, 2012
- 8 meeting. It was noted that Pat Goltl was missing from the October LAC meeting roster.
- 9

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10 LaBonde made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 2, 2012 LAC meeting, 11 with the roster update. The motion was seconded by LaGrange and passed unanimously.

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13 2013 Annual Work Plans

- 14 Farnsworth opened discussion the 2013 Annual Work Plans, which were distributed to the LAC
- 15 in advance. Czaplewski asked that the ED office check the numbers in the expenditures/income
- 16 for possible calculation errors. Czaplewski also asked that some mention of expected income or
- 17 recognition of land excesses be considered. Farnsworth will add a statement on page 3
- 18 highlighting that fact. LaGrange asked what the Special Advisors line consists of. Sackett said
- 19 special advisors for land are farm management firms that take care of farm administrative things
- 20 for the Program, such as agricultural/grazing leases, crop insurance, FSA responsibilities, etc.

- 22 The LAC proceeded through the sections of the work plan, organized by complex.
- 23
- 24 Non-Complex Lands
- Rabbe asked if phragmites control should be added as a specific line item. Sackett said that is considered a part of noxious weed control line item.
- 27
- 28 Plum Creek Complex
- 29 No specific comment.
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- 31 Cottonwood Ranch Complex
- 32 Shadle asked how the sediment augmentation project is going. Farnsworth said it was
- 33 challenging this year with very little flow. As a result, there is still sediment staged for transport
- 34 until higher flows return. The current plan is to attempt to cut channels through the staged
- 35 sediment to form interim tern and plover nesting areas, and then see how the sediment moves
- 36 during the SDHF in spring 2013. Shadle asked if there are the grazing is going to be adjusted in
- 37 2013. Tunnell said that nothing drastic is being changed. Drought impacts to the pastures will
- 38 be assessed and a possible slight reduction in stocking rate is the only expected change.

- 40 Elm Creek Complex
- 41 Brei informed the LAC that the Fox Wet Meadow Excavation project is to begin next week.
- 42 Farnsworth said PRRIP received good bids for the project and there is money in the 2012 budget
- 43 to cover seeding after the dirt work is complete. As a result like FK6 will be removed from the
- 44 2013 budget.



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46 Shoemaker Island Complex

Sackett said now that the decision on Platte River Caddisfly (of Not Warranted for Listing) has 47 48 been published by USFWS, the LAC will revisit tree clearing activities in the southern slough in 49 2013. Farnsworth said the money in line SI10 is for clearing the entire slough. Actual limits of 50 clearing will be discussed when the LAC revisits the issue. Rabbe asked if money should be 51 added to reroute water from the road ditch to the northern meadows. Farnsworth said the ED 52 Office is working on analyzing surface and ground water interactions, and looking for a better understanding before any construction is done. This analysis will take place in 2013 with likely 53 54 construction in 2014.

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Bendfeldt moved to recommend GC acceptance of the 2013 work plan and LAC budget. 56

- 57 LaBonde seconded and motion passed unanimously.

59 Land Offering Review at 2012002

Sackett introduced discussion of the exchange of land at tract 2012002. This includes the 60 acquisition of an easement on tract 1216 and cash in exchange for deed to tract 1212, a buffer 61 area of 2012002. Thorburn asked if the 1216 easement was a set distance from the river. Sackett 62 said the easement would cover the area where the Program cleared trees in 2010, 200 feet from 63 the bank across the property. Shadle said he is not clear on what the LAC is trying to approve. 64 Sackett said he is looking for the LACs support of the habitat value of 1216 and overall 65 improvement of the Program's holdings by the exchange. Shadle said it seems like the disposal 66 of 1212 might produce disturbance to the meadow to the west of 1212, for no apparent gain. 67 Brei said the gain to the Program is perpetual habitat management for 1 mile of river channel. 68 69 LaGrange asked about the habitat value of the meadow to the west of 1212. Schroeder said there 70 had been some tree clearing and general improvements there in the past, and that it is a decent wet meadow that has seen sandhill crane use. Shadle said NPPD already holds an easement on 71 72 this tract and believes there is the potential for conflict between NPPD's easement and the proposed conservation easement. Czaplewski said that the option presented is to give up buffer 73 74 area, realizing there may be a small potential disturbance, but gaining 1 mile of permanent river 75 channel control, where lots of Program work has already occurred and is still occurring. 76 Thorburn said he supports the value of this exchange to the Program, and believes it provides 77 additional benefit within the good neighbor policy by working with this landowner. 78 79 Thorburn moved to approve and advance the land exchange at 2012002, being tract 1212 80 and cash in exchange for a perpetual easement on 1216, on the basis of habitat. Motion was seconded by Labonde. Shadle said that he does not believe the Program will be able to 81 82 work around NPPD's easement. The motion was voted on and did not pass unanimously. 83 84 Brei reminded the LAC that when a motion does not receive unanimous support at the LAC, the

- 85 LAC is instructed to provide support for their view in support or in opposition of the motion, to
 - the ED office. These viewpoints will be compiled for the GC, who will make their own final 86
 - determination. 87
